GENERAL / COMMUNICATION

4. ENTRIES

4.1. Closing date for entries

The closing date for entries is Tuesday 23 March at 17:00 hours local time.

4.2. Entry procedure

Any non-priority competitors wishing to take part in WRC Croatia Rally 2021 must register and fill in the electronic entry form published at <http://registrations.fia.com/wrchrv> duly completed before the closing date for entries.

Manufacturers, P2 and P3 competitors who wish to score points, must make their entries by using the electronic standard rally entry form for their championships available in the FIA application at <https://registrations.fia.com/rally>.



The entry application should be accompanied by:

- The payment of total entry fee. A proof of payment of the entry fee should be sent by e-mail to the secretary of the rally (info@rally-croatia.com) by the closing date of entries
- Photocopies of:
 - FIA licenses of the competitor and both crew members
 - Driving licenses of both crew members
 - First page of the car homologation papers with the number, group and cylinder capacity

By sending an electronic form, the competitor undertakes to abide by the rules and regulations of the competition, as well as the prescriptions of the 2021 FIA WRC SR. Competitors representatives will bring the signed entry form to the Administrative Checks.

Referring to Art 6.3.1 of the 2021 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, the drivers willing to score points in the FIA WRC3 Championship must register with the FIA before the closing date of entries of the first rally entered.

Any non-priority competitors wishing to take part in WRC Croatia Rally 2021 must fill in and send the electronic entry form published at <http://registrations.fia.com/wrchrv> duly completed before the closing date for entries.

By submitting an entry form the competitor allows to publish the information mentioned in this entry application in the media. The entry form must be signed **by all parties** and presented in printed format by the representative of the team during the Administrative checks.

The competing car is entered by the driver or the co-driver as competitor.

Entry fee: € 3.000 + 25% VAT

Excluding Organiser's optional advertising € 5.000 + 25% VAT

Participation in reconnaissance only € 1.000 + 25% VAT

VAT is payable by all Competitors, except those Competitors from another EU member State who supply their VAT number with their entry.

- The payment must include all charges involved with the transfer
- Upon payment by bank transfer it is essential to provide the bank proof of payment by post or by e-mail to the Secretary of the Rally to certify that the payment has been sent prior to the close of entries (see SR Art. 4.1)
- Please ensure that the last name of the driver and “**CR2021 Entry Fee**” are included as a reference on the bank transfer document
- The full payment of the entry fee must be on the Organizers bank account before the closing date for entries. No entry will be accepted without the full payment.

4.6. Refunds

The entry fee will be refunded in full:

- To candidates whose entry has not been accepted
- In the case of the rally not taking place

The Organizer may partially refund entry fees if a competitor cannot take part in the event due to a duly proved case of force majeure. This must be applied for in writing (info@rally-croatia.com), giving the reason of withdrawal, before Tuesday 20 April (start of administrative checks), including competitors' bank details.



If a competitor is denied entry to Finland due to missing travel documents or inadequate or missing Covid-19 documentation, the organizer may keep a minimum 50% of the entry fee to cover any costs incurred. Organizers may refund 50% of the entry fee to those competitors who, for other reasons of force majeure (duly certified by their ASN), were unable to start in the rally. With the request of entry fee refund the competitor must send the organizer a certificate of force majeure given by his own ASN..

5. INSURANCE

5.1. Description of insurance cover

Each competitor must have an insurance policy for the vehicle he competes in, at competitor's requests, the Organizer's will take out an additional insurance valid for the period of the rally at competitor's expense. The service and team vehicles, even those bearing plates issued by the Organizer, may never be considered as official participants in the rally. They are therefore not covered by the insurance policy of the rally and will remain the sole responsibility of their owners.

5.2. Organizer's liability insurance

The Organizer provides a public and products liability insurance with the cover of 15,000,000€ per any one occurrence for the duration of the rally.

5.3. Duration of the insurance coverage

The insurance, for all competitors, will become effective at the start of procedure for car scrutineering. The insurance ceases at the end of the event (Prize-Giving Ceremony Podium) or at the end of post-event scrutineering (for the selected cars), in the case of withdrawal, disqualification or exclusion from the rally.

In the case of withdrawal, the time taken into account will be the closing time of the following TC.

Cars having retired and restarting the next day (Art.54 of 2021 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations) shall not be considered to have permanently retired.

5.4. Damage caused to the third party

Competitors are reminded that only damage caused to third parties by the Organizers and the entered drivers is covered by the insurance policy taken by the Organization. Injury to the drivers themselves or damage to participating cars is not covered by this insurance. By submitting their entries, the competitors, drivers and car owners waive any claims or rights to pursue action for damages in connection with the event against the Organizer.

In case of an accident, the competitor or their representative must notify the Secretary of the Rally (phone: +385 91 230 7569) as quickly as possible and within 24 hours. They must explain the circumstances under which the accident occurred, eventual causes and consequences. Likewise, they must mention the names and addresses of any witnesses. They must also mention the names and addresses of any injured people.

5.5. Limitation of indemnity

The Organizer declines any liability concerning the consequences caused by any fraudulent action taken by the competitor, may this be against the rules and regulations of the rally or against the laws of the country. Any service vehicles or reconnaissance cars, even those bearing the official identification of the organizer, may under no circumstances be considered as official participants of the rally, hence their insurance policies remain the sole responsibility of the owner.

6. ADVERTISING AND IDENTIFICATION

All advertising must comply with the Croatian law. Tobacco and alcoholic beverages advertising in Croatia is prohibited.

Organizer's compulsory advertising will be placed on the door numbers and the rally plates. Organizers optional advertising will be placed as shown in Appendix 4.

Details concerning all Rally advertising will be published in a bulletin.

Identification

Competition numbers and rally plates according to the 2021 FIA WRC SR Art. 28.2, will be provided by the Organizer. Rally plates and competition numbers must be affixed on the rally car before scrutineering as shown Appendix 4 of these regulations and must be visible through the entire duration of the rally.

7. TYRES

7.1. Tyres specified for use during the rally

In addition to complying with Art. 13, 14 and 15 of the 2021 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, the following types and quantities are confirmed for use:

Special attention is also drawn to the Appendix V of the 2021 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations regarding tyre regulations.

7.3. Tyres for use on reconnaissance

Only E- or DOT-approved homologated road legal tyres are allowed.

7.4. Tyre marking zone

The tyre marking zones are located at TC 0, 1C, 5C, 10C, 10G, 14C and 18E.

The Tyre Marking Zone will be located in a High Density Area but, contrary to the 2021 WRC Sporting Regulations, Art. 13.6, it will not be accessible to team members. The crews must work in this location without the support of an additional team member. It is not necessary to remove the wheel from the car, only to ensure that the outside surface of the wheel is clearly visible.

7.5. National laws or special requirements

The use of studded tyres is not allowed.



8. FUEL

All drivers must use FIA fuel as provided by the FIA appointed supplier. All the conditions in Art. 61 and 62 of the 2021 FIA WRC SR must be respected by all competitors. For environmental and safety reasons, all competitors must refuel in the designated refuel zones.

- At the exit of the Service Park

- 23 April - at the parking lot of restaurant "Žganjer" in Jaškovo

- 25 April - at the parking lot of restaurant "Zelenjak" in Kumrovec
GPS coordinates N 46° 3.588 E 15° 42.738 (see Road Book)

The Refuelling Zones will operate a ticketless process – Crews must wear PPE while in the Refuel zone. A member of the crew will open the vehicle to allow the operative to attach the pipework. The crew will be responsible to indicate to the refueller the amount of fuel required. The crew only shall close the vehicle and secure the opening once they are happy that they have the right amount of fuel added.

8.1. Ordering procedure

The cost of the fuel is € 5,60 + VAT per litre.

8.2. Closing date for ordering fuel

Closing date for ordering of FIA fuel is Thursday 8 April 2021.

8.3. Distribution for non-priority drivers

All drivers must use FIA fuel as provided by the FIA appointed supplier.

9. RECONNAISSANCE

See also Art. 35 in the 2021 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations. Schedule for the reconnaissance is published in Appendix 2 of these supplementary regulations.

Reconnaissance will take place in two groups. (See Appendix 2)

Competitors carrying out reconnaissance must do so in accordance with the recce schedule and according to the identification below. Following the Reconnaissance Road Book is recommended however individual route may be followed within the foreseen time schedule.

9.1. Procedure for registration

A reconnaissance registration form, duly completed, including details of the reconnaissance car, driver and co-driver names, Competitor's accommodation during the rally and team's contact phone number has to be sent by e-mail to info@rally-croatia.com before the start of Reconnaissance. The form will be published in the Competitors section on www.rally-croatia.com.



Identification numbers, given at the registration shall be affixed on the car (windscreen at the top corner of co-driver's side and both side windows) and kept visible for the duration of the reconnaissance period. There will be no signing of a recce timecard to prevent transmission of Covid-19. The passages will be recorded by a check-list, GPS-units and police/rally marshals' checks on the stages.

9.1.1. Participation in reconnaissance only

Any driver holding an appropriate international license but not entered in the rally may apply to take part in the reconnaissance. The regulations on reconnaissance must be respected in their entirety. A registration form for this purpose will be sent on request. The final permission for taking part in recce is left to the discretion of the organizer. An administrative fee of € 1.000 will be charged. Final date of registration for reconnaissance only is Thursday 8 April.

9.2. Collection of reconnaissance tracking device

With reference to Art. 35.4.4 of the 2021 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, all cars must carry recce GPS trackers for speed control during reconnaissance.

Device may be collected either by one crew member or a representative. The GPS reconnaissance tracking device supplier SAS will only have a contactless payment for the rental of the GPS device. Please see <https://wrc.statusas.com/shop/recce> to process all payments.

9.3. Specific and national restrictions

9.3.1. Passages

Crews are authorised to drive a maximum of 2 times through each special stage in accordance with the schedules given in Appendix 2. The special stages must be driven in the same direction as the rally, at a reduced speed and fully respecting the Traffic Laws. All special stages that are run twice during the rally may only be driven as one stage during recce. All passages through the special stages will be recorded by the reconnaissance trackers and by the marshals on the special stages.

9.3.2. Speed limits

During reconnaissance, the speed limit is 80 kph, unless another speed limit is indicated by traffic signs or by written instructions in the Road Book (or in bulletins). All national traffic regulation must be followed on special stage. All crews are reminded of Art. 34.2 in the 2021 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations.

9.3.2. Tyres

For reconnaissance tyre regulations see Art. 7.2.

- ASN authorization for all foreign competitors and/or drivers (if required)
- Completion of all details on the entry form including signatures
- Car registration papers

Notwithstanding of the 2021 WRC Sporting Regulations, Art. 30.1, drivers and co-drivers are not required to report personally to the administrative checks. Competitors may send a representative of the Crew presenting all requested documents. The entry form must be signed **by all parties** and presented in printed format by the representative of the team during the Administrative checks.

The recce and rally materials will be provided in sealed bags and sanitised before submission. In order to receive the package, administrative checks must be fully completed. Any additional documents to be handed to Crews will use the same system.

Manufacturers may make their administrative check by appointment.

11. SCRUTINEERING, SEALING AND MARKING

11.1. Scrutineering venue and timetable

11.1.1. Preparations

The homologation form of the rally car and certificates on roll cage and fuel tank must be brought to scrutineering. The bodyshell and engine will be marked with a special device and the competitor must prepare their car (on a visible place) in order to fit a wire, a plate and a seal on the engine block.

11.2. Mud flaps (Appendix J Article 252.7.7)

It is possible to fit transverse mud flaps in conformity with the article Appendix J, Art. 252.7.7.

11.3. Windows / Nets (Appendix J Article 253.11)

Use of tinted windows is authorized in accordance with Article 253.11 "Windows/nets" of Appendix J of the FIA Sporting Code.

11.4. Driver's safety equipment

Drivers safety equipment will be checked at scrutineering.

Details on the safety equipment can be found in Appendix 5 of these regulations.

Competitors are reminded that two belt cutters must be carried on board at all times. They must be easily accessible to driver



and co-driver when seated with their safety belts fastened (Art. 253-6, Appendix J).

Each competing car must carry a red "SOS" sign and on the reverse a green "OK" sign measuring at least 42 cm x 29.7 cm (A3), in conformity to 2021 FIA WRC SR Article 53.2.

11.5. Noise level

At any time on the road sections, the noise level must be in conformity with Appendix J. See also 2021 FIA WRC SR Art. 18.4.

11.6. Special national requirements

Each competing car must be equipped with a first aid kit and 1 reflective triangle and two reflective jackets. This equipment will be checked at Scrutineering and may be checked during the event.

11.7. Safety Tracking System

In accordance with Art. 53.2.1 of the 2021 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, all competitors must make provisions in their rally cars for the installation of the FIA Safety Emergency Console System and the emergency button, and the system must be installed before the car is brought to scrutineering. For Installation instructions see Appendix 6. Systems may be collected either by the crew or a representative.

No deposit will be collected for the rally safety tracking equipment but all the damage caused will be invoiced afterwards. The FIA Safety Emergency Console System devices must be removed in the final parc fermé. They must be returned no later than 20:00 hrs on Sunday 25 April to STATUS AWARENESS SYSTEM (SAS) truck in Service Park.

12. OTHER PROCEDURES

12.1. Opening ceremony procedure

The start list for the Section 1 will be published on Thursday 22 April at 16:00. The TC 0 - Start Podium / Holding IN will take place on Thursday 22 April at 19:45 in the Hrvatske bratske zajednice street 4 p.p. 550, HR-10000 Zagreb, near the Rally Office. After the TC 0A - Holding OUT cars will continue to the SSS 1.

12.2. Finish procedure

The finish of the competition element of the Rally and the podium ceremony will take place on the podium in the Trg Svetog Marka Zagreb on Sunday 25 April. After checking in at TC 22A, all cars must immediately continue to podium area and follow the instructions from the marshals. Prizes for all Competitors/crews will be awarded on the Podium. For the first, second and third in the overall classification an "Olympic-style" podium. After the prize giving for the top three overall, the prize giving for all other competitors will follow. After completing the finish ceremony all cars (except cars subject to final checks) must be driven to the Parc Fermé. The competitive element of the rally will finish at the TC 22B „Parc ferme IN”.

12.2.1 Removal of the cars from final Parc Fermé

After the authorization by the Stewards the cars may be removed from final Parc Fermé. Provided that the above takes place as scheduled, all cars must be removed no later than 20:00 on Sunday 25 April. In order to collect their cars, drivers or their authorized representative must show the "Removal of car from the final PF" document issued by the Organizers to the marshal in charge which must be then placed in a sealed box before removing the vehicle. This document will be distributed to Competitors at collection of the other documents.

12.3. Permitted early check-in

Crews are authorized to check-in early (before their target time) at the following time controls; TC 1A, 10C, 10D, 18C, 22A and 22B, without incurring a penalty for early arrival.

12.4. Any special procedures

12.4.1 Start of the rally

The competition element of the rally starts at TC 0 (Start Podium) on Thursday 22 April at 19:45.



12.4.2 Start order and intervals

The start intervals will be according to FIA WRC SR Art. 41.2.

12.4.3. Shakedown

All drivers (except for P1 P1 and those requested by the FIA) wishing to participate in Shakedown, must send an e-mail to info@rally-croatia.com confirming their wish to participate. Closing date for Shakedown registration is Thursday 8 April.

Shakedown will take place on Thursday 22 April at SD Medvedgrad as follows:

- P1, P2 09:01 - 11:00
- P1, P2, P3 and P4 11:01 - 13:00
- All drivers 13:01 - 15:00

The stage is 4,60 km long and is located 11,99 km from Service Park.

All P1, P2 and other requested by the FIA and WRC Promoter will be required to complete their first passage of Shakedown in order of Championship classification, and at an interval as determined by the Organizer in consultation with the FIA and WRC Promoter.

A start list for this first passage will be published on Wednesday 21 April at 17:00.

At the conclusion of these fixed passages, P1, P2 drivers will be able to continue their Shakedown runs with one minute interval in their correct time slot. During the Shakedown, the main Service Park will be used.

12.4.4. Power Stage

With reference to Art. 50 in the 2021 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations SS Zagorska Sela - Kumrovec 2 will be run as "Wolf Power Stage".

12.4.5. Promotional activities

Promotional activities, if any, will be published in a Bulletin.

12.4.6. Crew-related air vehicles

Only helicopters registered with the Organizer and following the instructions of the organizer are permitted to fly within the airspace of the rally area and land at the service areas or other sites during the rally.

12.4.7. On Board Cameras

As per article 18.1 of the 2021 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, the Competitor of any car which carries an on- board camera, must have the prior agreement of the Promoter. Authorized cameras will be identified by an adhesive decal and must be mounted in the car at the time of scrutineering.

12.4.8. Permanent FIA Passes

Access to the event will not be guaranteed by presentation of a permanent FIA Pass only - due to COVID - 19 requirements - any access to a controlled environment will require a pass created and issued by the Organizer. The Organizer may require specific conditions to be performed (a non-exhaustive list may include pre-event or local COVID-19 testing, recording of details for a track/trace system, requirement to join a specific group and not to mix between groups etc. Final details of the local pass requirements will be issued by bulletin.

12.5. Official time used during the rally

Official time throughout the entire rally will be UTC-GPS time.

12.6 Restart after retirement

With reference to Art. 54 in 2021 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations any crews which fails to complete a section will be assumed to re-start the rally from the start of the next section following the overnight regroup. If not, they must confirm with the Clerk of the course by completion of the form located in the Road Book and lodging it with the Organizer as soon as possible before the publication of the entry list for the following Section".

Any crew re-starting the rally must present their cars at the overnight Parc Fermè at the latest 4 hours before the start of the next section following the overnight regroup.



12.7 Time Card

All time cards will be given to the competitors at administrative checks.

12.8 CONTROL PROCEDURES AND TIME CARD HANDLING

GENERAL

- a) The following procedures apply and have priority over all the related provisions in the 2021 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations as far as they are in conflict. Some of the conflicting article numbers are quoted below, but without claiming to be exhaustive.
- b) Any irregularity or discrepancies regarding the below procedures will result in the application of 2021 WRC Sporting Regulations, Art. 19.3.4 and 44.2.12. It is to be noted that, as a principle, the entries recorded on the timing marshals' check-sheets shall be decisive.
- c) The complete set of Time Cards for the whole rally (including the Shakedown time cards for all drivers affected under 2021 WRC Sporting Regulations, Art. 36.2.2) will be delivered with the rally materials at administrative checks. It is imperative for all crews to carry at least all the Time Card sets for a whole day inside the car (cf. for example procedures at regrouping controls).

PASSAGE CONTROLS (2021 WRC Sporting Regulations, Art. 43)

At these controls, the marshal will simply mark the car number on his check sheet as soon as the car stops at the control, without mentioning the time of passage, and show the check sheet to the co-driver.

TIME CONTROLS

- a) The check-in procedure begins at the moment as stipulated in Art. 44.2.1 of the 2021 WRC Sporting Regulations.
- b) The check-in time corresponds to the moment at which the co-driver shows their Time card to the timekeeper through the side window (2021 WRC Sporting Regulations, Art. 44.1 and Art. 44.2.4).
- c) The appropriate timekeeper will then enter the actual time at which the card was shown on the timing tablet and write it on the check sheet (2021 WRC Sporting Regulations, Art. 44.2.5).
- d) They will then show the recorded check-in time and, in case of a Time Control followed by a special stage, the provisional special stage start time to the co-driver. The co-driver shall then enter this time on their time card (2021 WRC Sporting Regulations, Art. 44.2.5).

SPECIAL STAGE START

- a) At the start line, the co-driver shows the timekeeper the time card through the side window. The timekeeper then either confirms this provisional start time or shows a different start time on his check-sheet.
- b) This new time, if any, shall then be recorded as actual start time on the time card by the co-driver (2021 WRC Sporting Regulations, Art. 48.2.3). This actual start time will also be shown on the electronic start count-down display.

SPECIAL STAGE STOP POINT

- a) The timekeeper at the stop point will show the finish time (time of the day: hour, minute, second, tenth of a second and thousands for the Power Stage) and the calculated stage time to the crew (co-driver).
- b) The co-driver shall record this time on their time card.

REGROUPING CONTROLS (2021 WRC Sporting Regulations, Art. 46)

- a) There is no need to hand in the Time Card used for the Section concerned.
- b) For regroupings during a day, the crews shall themselves record their re-start time from the regroup as instructed by the timing marshal on their new time card for the following Section of that day.
- c) In case of an overnight regroup, the crew shall themselves record their re-start time of the following day on their time card, following the publication of the start list for the section after the overnight regroup.
- d) Point b. above shall likewise be applied by the drivers concerned for the Shakedown TC/start time.

14. PRIZES

The prize giving will take place on the podium at the finish of the event on Sunday 25 April at 14:00 for:

- General Classification - 1st, 2nd and 3rd place
- Manufacturer - 1st place
- WRC 2 - 1st, 2nd and 3rd place
- WRC 3 - 1st, 2nd and 3rd place
- FIA Junior WRC - 1st, 2nd and 3rd place
- Special prizes - list will be published as CoC Communication on the Digital Notice Board before the start of the rally

15. FINAL CHECKS AND PROTESTS

15.1. Final checks

The final checks will take place at Service Park, Zagreb Fair, on Sunday 25 April immediately after arrival at TC 22B.

Cars subject to final checks (announced to the competitors concerned at TC 22B) must have one representative of the competitor as well as a limited number of mechanics with PPE (in case of dismantling) present at the final check.

15.2. Protest deposit

The protest deposit is 1.000 € (2021 FIA WRC SR Art. 65.2.).

If a protest requires the dismantling and re-assembly of different parts of the car, the claimant must pay an additional deposit as stipulated in the FIA ISC Art. 13.4.3.

15.2.1 Additional fees

For a protest involving only a clearly defined part of the car (engine, transmission, steering, braking system, electrical installation, body work, etc.) - additional deposit to be determined by the Stewards.

For a protest involving the whole car - additional deposit to be determined by the Stewards.

The expenses incurred by the work and by the transport of the car shall be borne by the claimant if the protest is unfounded, or by the competitor against whom the protest is lodged if it is upheld. If the protest is unfounded, and the expenses are higher than the amount of the deposit, the difference shall be borne by the claimant. Conversely if the expenses are less, the difference shall be returned to them.

15.3. Appeal deposit

The international appeal deposit is 6.000 €.

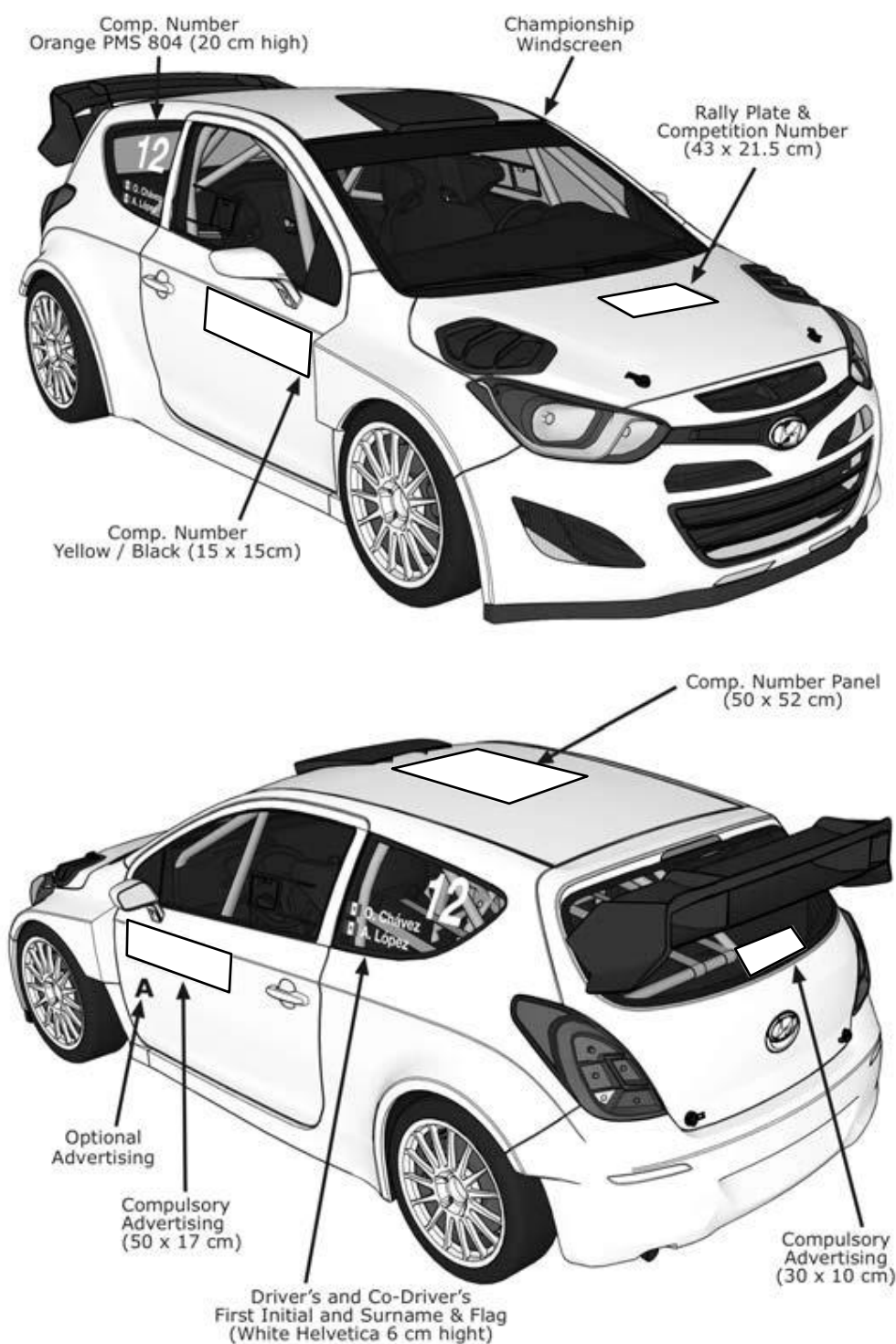

APPENDIX 5 - Extracts from FIA Appendix L relating to overalls, helmets and any other safety requirements

Helmets (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 1)

All crews must wear crash helmets homologated to one of the following FIA standards:

- 8858-2002 or 8858-2010 (Technical List N°41)
- 8859-2015 (Technical List N°49)
- 8860-2010 (Technical List N°25 and 33)
- 8860-2018 or 8860-2018-ABP (Technical List N°69)

Priority 1 drivers and their co-drivers must wear helmets according to the FIA standard 8860-2018 or 8860-2018-ABP.

Frontal Head Restraint (FHR, Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3)

All crews must use FIA approved FHR systems homologated to FIA standard 8858.

Approved FHRs, anchorages and tethers are listed in Technical List N° 29. See also helmet compatibility chart in Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3.3.

Flame-resistant clothing (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2)

All drivers and co-drivers must wear overalls as well as gloves (optional for codrivers), long underwear, a balaclava, socks and shoes homologated to the FIA 8856-2000 standard (Technical List N°27) or 8856-2018 (Technical List N° 74).

For Priority 1 drivers and their co-drivers, the wearing of equipment homologated to the FIA 8856-2018 standard is obligatory.

Please pay special attention to the prescriptions of Art. 2 concerning embroidery and printing on flame-resistant clothing (manufacturer certificates etc.) **as well as concerning the correct wearing of the clothing elements! See also Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, Article 53.1.**

Biometric Devices (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2.1)

Drivers may wear a device to collect biometric data during racing:

- If the biometric device is integrated into a protective garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856, the garment shall be homologated to FIA Standards 8856 and 8868-2018
- If the biometric device is a stand-alone device, then the device must be homologated to FIA Standard 8868-2018 only. This device must be worn in addition to the garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856

Wearing of jewellery (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 5)

The wearing of jewellery in the form of body piercing or metal neck chains is prohibited during the competition and may therefore be checked before the start.

Welcome

This manual is provided as a guide for the installation of the WRC Tracking System Kit, for competition vehicles only. Care should be taken when considering the location of components with regard to electrical cabling and fire suppression systems already installed in the vehicle. Please check always that the components of your kit are as requested.

1. Tracking Unit Kit Components & Steps

The WRC Tracking System Kit includes:

- WRC Tracking Installation and Fitting Kit Instruction Sheet;
- 3-in-1 antenna with leads;
- Internal radio antenna with lead;
- 6 - 24v wiring loom with plug;
- Mount, to be bolted to tunnel;



(Contents may differ slightly to image shown)

WRC tracking system fitment steps:

1. Mount WRC tracker;
2. Fit external & internal antennas, running leads to the WRC tracker;
3. Fit wiring loom, ensuring that a solid 9 to 28 volts is supplied;
4. Connect all antenna connections, make sure they are tight using an 8mm spanner;
5. Apply power.

2. Power Supply

WRC tracking system requires a reliable power supply from 9 to 28 volts DC. We recommend a 5 amp (Max) blade type or similar quality fuse is used at the battery supply end of the WRC tracking system power lead.

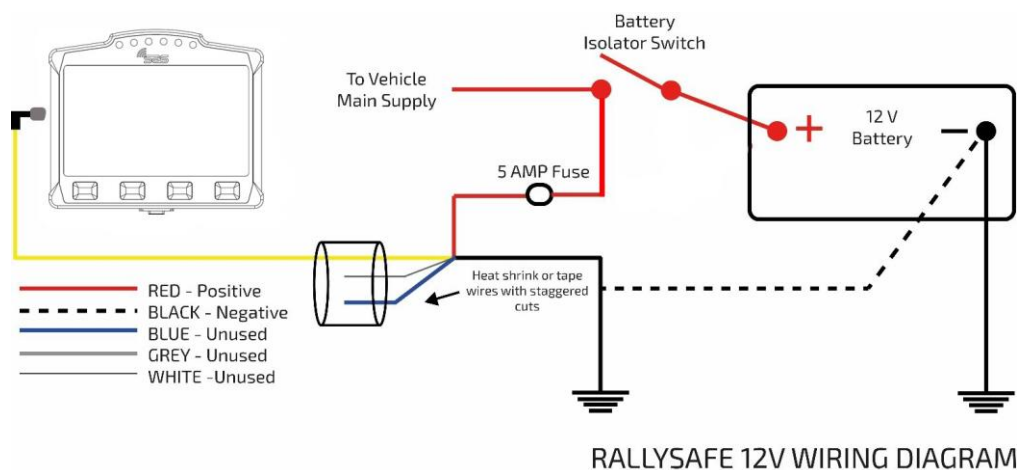
Zero volts or battery negative can be picked up at any suitable earthing point providing the isolation switch does not switch the negative side of the battery.

The WRC tracking system unit has an internal battery that is kept charged via the car's power supply. It acts as a reserve supply to power the unit in the case of an accident where a car's power supply is interrupted (e.g. car battery smashed or dislodged).

Note: The tracking device should only be powered once it is placed in its final position in the vehicle; this ensures accelerometers are calibrated correctly.

3. Connection Diagram

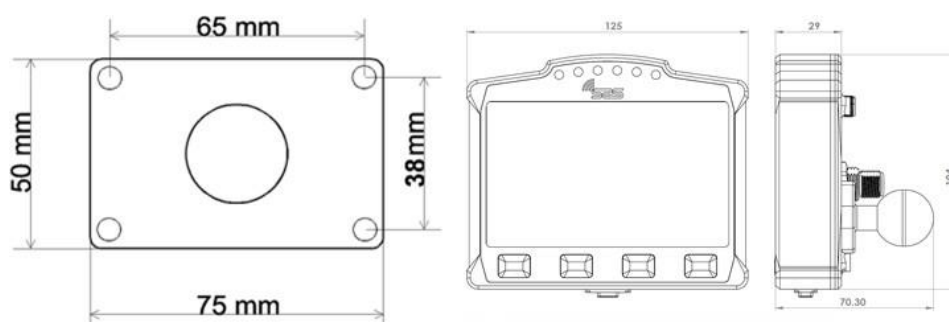
The 6-24v wiring loom, includes five wires. The white blue and grey wires must be stagger cut and heat shrunk or taped back so they cannot short to ground or to each other. Red and black are used as follows:



During installation, the wiring loom should be routed away from the engine compartment, Ignition or Alternator wiring.

300 mm of Power Supply Wiring Loom is required to be available for connection to the WRC Tracker Unit at the mounted position.

5. Tracking Unit Mounting

The preferred location and mounting for the WRC tracking system unit is a RAM style 50mm x 75mm flat base with ball, bolted through the tunnel with four **M6** Bolts.

It should be in a central, protected location on the central tunnel in front of the seats and both easily visible and accessible by both the driver and co-driver/nav.

Care should be taken when considering the location of the Mounting Point with regard to electrical cabling and fire suppression systems installed in the vehicle.

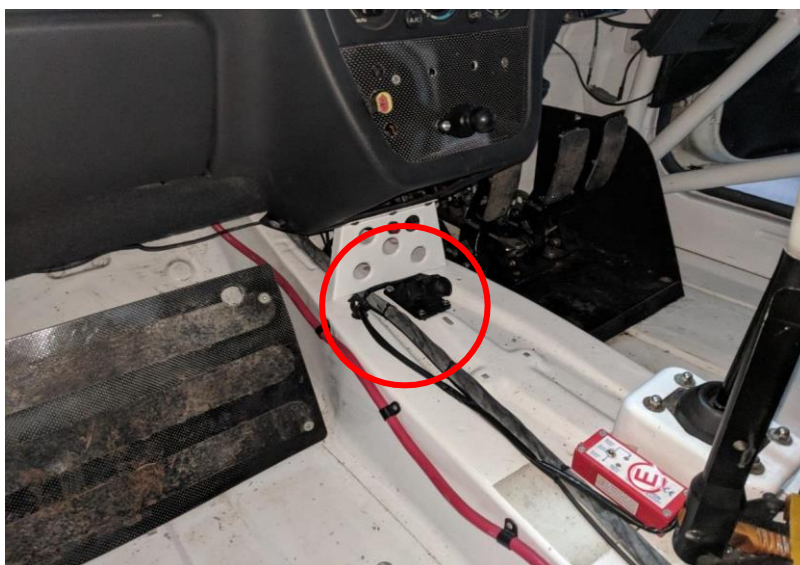


Figure 1. 25mm rubber ball securely attached to the tunnel

Photographs of mounting and positioning can be seen in Fig.1 and Fig.2 respectively.

Alternatively, the WRC tracking system unit can be mounted in a central protected location on the vehicle dashboard that is easily visible and accessible by both the driver and co-driver.

Mounting is a Ram style 50mm x 75mm flat base with ball, bolted with four **M6** bolts through the dashboard and a compulsory 3mm backing plate measuring no less than 145mm x 120mm

6. Antenna Installation

All leads on both external and internal antennas must run on the inside of all roll cage bars. This is to stop cable crushing on impact.

Antenna must not be mounted within 200 mm of any high frequency antenna's or cabling.

The preferred route is to go down from the antenna, underneath the closest part of the roll cage (roof cross or main hoop), follow that along to the roof hoop, then go down the inside A pillar to the unit. Please allow 200mm clearance of high frequency antenna or cabling.

Any excess cable must be run so that the cable is not bent any tighter than a 100mm radius. We recommend running it across the underside of the dash and back (do not coil in tight loops).

Cables must be tied neatly along the whole installation all the way to the unit so they can't be accidentally caught or dislodged.

All this will be checked at scrutineering and you may be required to fix it before your car can pass.

Note:

All antenna connections need to be firmly tightened with an 8mm spanner.

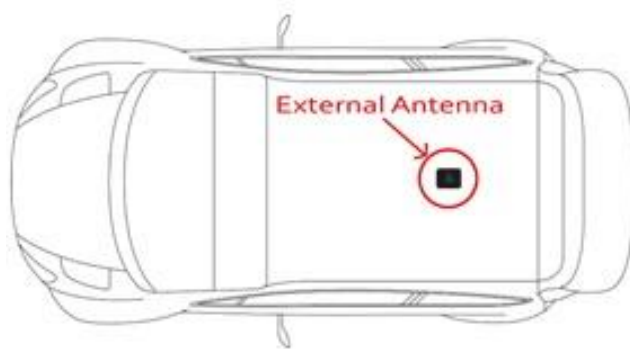
6.1. External Antenna

The antenna is mounted through a 12mm hole in a central location on the ROOF of the vehicle, rear of the main roll bar hoop, allowing the cabling to pass



through the roof and follow the cage bars back to the unit location. The antenna is a fully watertight unit, which seals against the roof surface.

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Antenna leads are connected as follows (There may be variations with the type and number of leads).

1. The 2 UHF leads, colour-coded **Blue**, is connected to the terminal labelled "WiFi" on the WRC unit (Right Hand Thread). Terminals are located of the rear of the unit and/or colour-coded Blue.
2. The Satellite Communication antenna lead is connected to the center or rear terminal labelled "IRI" (Left Hand Thread). It may also be colour-coded **Yellow** (this may be not marked on the 2- in-1 antenna).
3. The GPS antenna lead labelled "GPS", is connected to the terminal labelled "GPS" on the WRC unit (Right Hand Thread). Terminals may be on the side or rear of the unit and/or colour-coded **Green**.
4. GSM, has a small stick antenna supplied with the WRC unit, and is connected to corresponding terminal labelled "GSM" on the WRC unit (Left Hand Thread). The terminal is located on the rear of the unit and/or colour-coded **Red**.

6.2 Internal Antenna

The Internal Antenna should be placed on the inside of the ROOF in a clear uncluttered area, with a 200mm radius clear of any bar work or solid metal object. The internal antenna has a magnetic base with double-sided tape for adhesion. The cable is then run to the WRC unit. Please keep cable on the inner side of the roll cage pipework so as not to be crushed in the event of an accident.

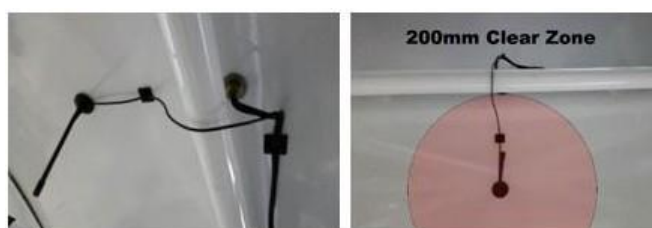


Figure 3. The internal antenna must be at least 200mm away from any roll cage components

Welcome

The SAS System is designed to increase competition safety by providing safety notifications to inform event management, improve response times and provide accurate and reliable event times.

The following document outlines the basic features and functions of the WRC tracking unit. Please note that the WRC Tracking unit must be fitted and connected in all competitor's car, in accordance with the SAS Fitting Kit Manual - RALLY CAR.

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1. Powering The Unit On

The unit is pre-loaded with all of the stage coordinates and is activated when powered on. Please power the unit on early before the event to give it time to run checks.

When powered on the unit will display the transport mode, the details of which are specified in the Art. 2.1 of this document.

The unit does not need to be powered off at any stage during the event as it will go to sleep within a few minutes of inactivity but can be re-woken by either moving the vehicle or pressing any of the four buttons.

It is recommended that the unit is not powered off during the event, to ensure the internal battery stays fully charged for emergencies.

2. Unit Modes

The unit has two modes:

- When not in a competitive stage, the unit will be in **transport mode**, as described in 2.1.
- When in a competitive stage, the unit will go into **stage mode**, as described in 2.2.

2.1. Transport Mode

SCREEN 1 - The transport mode displays from the top down the following information: the name of the next point you are travelling to, the time in transit, current time, accumulative and intermediate distances and speed, average speed.

The unit has four physical buttons. Their functions are reported on the screen right above the button's location.

Starting from the far left button to the right, you have the following options:

- **OPTIONS**: Operation described in 5. Transport Menu.
- **BRIGHT**: Increase the screen brightness (Note that the screen must always be clearly readable so full brightness is recommended for

- daytime).
- DIM: Decrease the screen brightness,
- RESET: Intermediate trip meter

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2.2. Stage Mode

SCREEN 2 - When the start official assigns each individual competitor a due start time, a countdown will display on the unit as shown in the white field below. Also shown in the white field is the stage number and the due start time.

SCREEN 3 - Once the start time is reached, the screen will turn green as shown below and the competitor has to proceed into stage.

SCREEN 4 - Once the competitor has started the stage, the unit will automatically switch to on stage mode. The unit will start timing.

SCREEN 5 - If the start is postponed for whatever reason and the start time is cancelled, the unit will display the Transport Screen. Once it is clear to send cars again the official will re-issue a new start time.

3. Hazard Alerts

The unit's primary function is to help alert race control of incidents on the course. The incident is notified to race control with different levels of hazard depending on the severity.

SCREEN 6 - If a car stops during a stage for longer than 3 seconds, the unit will automatically transmit a HAZARD notification; this can either be upgraded to OK or downgraded to SOS by pressing the corresponding button to the text. A timer counts up to 60 seconds as an indication to press the "OK".

SCREEN 7 - If you select OK after the HAZARD alert, then the following screen will appear, showing that you and the car are OK.



SCREEN 7. OK Acknowledgement

SCREEN 8 - If the manual SOS button is pressed, it must be confirmed as either a fire or medical SOS by pressing one of the two middle buttons. It can also be cancelled if pressed by mistake. If a car is involved in a High G impact, an automatic SOS message will display. If no urgent assistance is required, you can downgrade to OK by selecting the corresponding button.



SCREEN 8. Confirm Fire SOS or Medical SOS

SCREEN 9 - When the SOS is confirmed, the screen 9 will display. Even once confirmed, the hazard can be changed to OK. Pressing OK will inform race control that the crew are OK and do not need medical assistance.

4. Red Flag

SCREEN 10 - In the case of a serious incident, a stage may be red flagged from Race Control. The red flag will display a full screen warning until it is acknowledged. To acknowledge the flag the far left button must be pressed.



SCREEN 8. Confirm Fire SOS or Medical SOS

SCREEN 11 - Once the red flag has been acknowledged, normal stage functions will display with a warning still at the top of the screen.



SCREEN 11. RED FLAG in Stage Mode

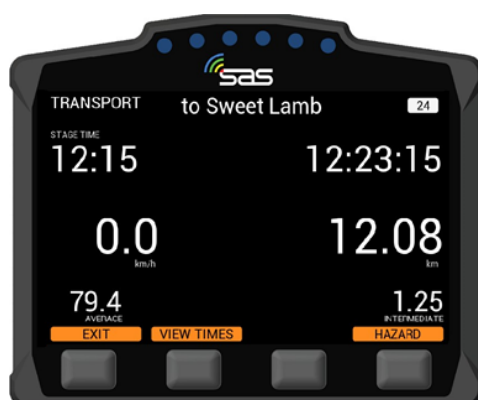
5. Transport Menu

SCREEN 12 - In transport mode, the unit has a menu that can be accessed by pressing the options button.

SCREEN 13 - The option menu will allow the crew to view stage times “VIEW TIMES” or send a manual hazard/SOS “SEND HAZARD”.



SCREEN 13. Transport Mode – View times/Send Hazard

5.1. Stage Times

SCREEN 14 - By pressing the “VIEW TIMES” button, provisional transit and competitive stage times will display. You can select times for any of the completed stages with the next and previous buttons.

5.2. Manual Hazard

SCREEN 15 - If manual hazard is sent in transport mode, this can be upgraded or downgraded the same way as a stage hazard. If the hazard is no longer required, it can also be cancelled by pressing either of the two middle buttons "PRESS TO CANCEL".
